SCHOLARSHIP AWARDED



The recipient of this scholarship is **Joy Lacanienta** who is pursuing her Ph.D. in Sociology, as well as an Advanced Certification in Women's Studies. She has over 23 years background on Community Organizing and Advocacy. Her area of interest involves aging, poverty and issues affecting immigrant and migrant communities.

Recently, Joy acted as the conference coordinator for the Healthy and Resilient Aging (HRA) 2016 International Conference. She produced a documentary about aging domestic workers in Hawaii and was selected to take part in the Hawaii Governor's Taskforce on Community Campaign Awareness for the Domestic Worker's Bill of Rights. Joy also directed and produced "Unsheltered Crimes," a documentary about the criminalization of poverty by incarcerating the unsheltered population of Hawaii. The case study involves the correlation of poverty, aging, immigrant communities, and the ramifications of being repeatedly incarcerated.
