CONTACT YOUR LEGISLATORS

On July 1, 2025, the Senate passed HR 1, the budget reconciliation bill that would strip health care from over 17 million people, and postpone the nursing home minimum staffing rule for 10 years. Next it goes to the House for a vote. But the main issue with the bill is that it could result in state Medicaid budgets receiving less money and reductions in benefits and services for kupuna and disabled individuals. Home and community services will likely be cut first, leading to higher costs for institutionalization. It is imperative that we reach out to our representatives and tell them to say NO to these unnecessary and destructive cuts to Medicaid.
